




Shoji Screen Feature Ring




Layout of Block with Subassemblies

Cut parts to length


Start Assembly




Add end veneers using Molding and Trim Glue




Sand off excess veneer being careful not to remove any of the face veneer

Sand ends flush with end veneer


Assembly Step 3



Add end elements and clean up on the disk sander




Complete Feature Ring




Cut mitered elements and veneer spacers then glue up ring. Top and bottom veneer rings will be added as bowl is assembled [return](#)

Jim Duxbury shared his Dux Chuck Deluxe, a Dux Chuck mounted on Cole Jaws in a Talon chuck. Below, Jim shared a square handled spindle gouge.



Billy Burt added a bushing and homemade base to his palm router to create a fluting jig. This does two things. 1) The piece being fluted becomes the template. 2) The bushing controls the depth of cut.
