

Photo requirements for newsletter submission

We're always looking for new imagery for **your** newsletter, Wood Turners Worldwide, but what does it take for your image to make it?

The answer is simple, but we'll break the requirements down for you!

- 1. You must be a club member. Guess what? If you're reading this, attend weekly meetings, are on our mailing list, or are a member of our Facebook group, you're a club member! There are no dues, no other requirements then that you participate, even if only occasionally.
- 2. Photos must be e-mailed to editor@worldwidewoodturners.org. Many members share their images via our Facebook group, which we encourage, however, once uploaded to Facebook, images are stripped of as

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much data as possible to allow for rapid screen loads. Once stripped, the data is lost. We need your original photos.

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- 3. High resolution photos are necessary. The smaller the file, the less data, and the worse a photo looks in print layout. 12 mega pixel or greater .jpg images saved at 100% are best. You should be able to find these settings in your camera app on your phone. If you're using a DSLR, you should be able to manipulate file size settings in your photo menu on the camera.
- 4. In focus photos with wide margins in the camera lens allow for cropping, resizing, and rotation in the layout program. As long as the photo subject fills at least 2/3rds of your high resolution image, I can work with resizing and cropping.
- 5. I will generally select well lit, sharply focused images. We want to display your art as true to life as possible!
