

How does Bob Grinstead get such uniform parallel lines in his basket illusion pieces? As pictured above, he fashioned a plywood platform following the outline of the piece, and, using an indexing wheel and his homemade pyrography machine, simply moves the bit from side to side, burning the exquisite basket illusion vase seen to the right.
